Selection Criteria

As you examine Latino Web sites on the Internet, it is important to know your information is reliable, accurate, and timely. Since links to information and Web resources change frequently, it is also worth ensuring you are looking at the most current materials. The sites included in this guide were chosen using the following criteria:

- The Web site publisher is clearly identified and can be contacted from the site.
- The Web site’s purpose is stated in writing and is obvious when looking at the content.
- The information provided is comprehensive or uniquely important to Latino studies.
- The Web site is well known in the Latino community. It is cited in multiple subject resources, both print and online.
- The information provided is current and regularly updated. Revision dates are posted on the site.
- The Web site is well organized and easy to use. Multimedia features enhance, rather than distract from, the content offerings.
- The Web site includes a search or index function for easier navigation.
- The Web site adheres to accessibility conventions widely accepted in the Internet community.

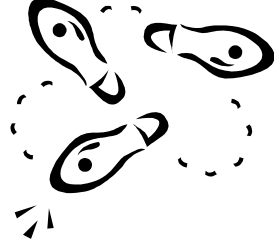
